One of the best ways to learn is to ask questions. Interestingly, the most significant summary of our Catholic faith was written by St. Thomas Aquinas (called the *Summa Theologica* – Summary of Theology) and is set up in a question-and-answer format. It's hard to believe an answer if you don't understand the question it is addressing. The Q&A below is no *Summa Theologica*, but hopefully some of these reflections will answer questions that are important to you.

Q. I heard people talking the other day about how we are saved. I always thought we could only be saved by Jesus, but some of them said we could be saved by good works. What's the right answer?

A. Interestingly, the two answers are not opposed to each other!

So how are we saved? By Jesus or by being good? In practice, many people believe, whether they realize it or not, that they will make it to Heaven if they try to be good. Though there is some truth to this, it's important to explain how this works. Otherwise we might fall into the trap of thinking that we can save ourselves by doing good. And that's just not possible.

First of all, there is only one way to Heaven: Jesus! Jesus did not come to die on the cross just so that some people could get to Heaven through Him and others could find their own way. No, Jesus is the one and only way we are saved. In fact, if someone who knows nothing about Jesus, because they have never been taught, dies and goes to Heaven, they made it to Heaven because of Jesus. For example, if a baby dies and goes to Heaven, that child has not been able to consciously acknowledge Jesus as his or her savior while in life. This is not their fault, given their age. Jesus is their savior and the savior of everyone in Heaven.

With that said, what about good works? Can good works save us? There is some truth to good works having the power to save us, but we must understand what is really happening. If we are living in God's grace, then we are in what's called "a state of grace." This means that the gift of Jesus' death and resurrection is active and alive in our lives. It also means that if we die in this state of grace, we will go to Heaven once we are purified of all remnants of sin. But, regarding our good works, we need to see a certain essential connection to the saving grace of the cross and how we live. The fact of the matter is that if we have Jesus' grace alive in our lives, we will do good works. And on the flip side, if we are not doing any good works, it is a clear sign that we are not in His grace and thus will not be saved. So the grace of Jesus as our savior will be seen in our actions too.

One other key factor is that truly "good works" are actions in us that come from God. We don't choose to do a good work by our own will: rather, we do a good work only when we respond to a special inspiration of grace and let God work through us.

In the Bible, the letter of St. James explains this very well. He says, "So also faith of itself, if it does not have works, is dead. Indeed someone might say, 'You have faith and I have works.' Demonstrate your faith to me without works, and I will demonstrate my faith to you from my works" ([James 2:17-18](#)). In other words, faith, salvation and good works are all essentially

Feast Days and Memorials

Nov 9: Dedication of St John Lateran Basilica

The original magnificent Lateran Basilica was established as the Papal cathedral by Emperor Constantine. It had been the palace of the Laterani family and was named the Church of Christ Our Savior. Destroyed repeatedly by fire, earthquakes and war, rebuilt and rededicated under different names, the term "The Lateran" was used in the context that we refer to "The Vatican" today. The feast day celebrates, not the building or its history, but the union the universal church has in communion with our Holy Father.

Nov 10: St Leo the Great, 400-461

Leo, a prominent deacon of the Church during the pontificate of Pope Celestine I, was widely respected for his love for the Lord, his intelligence and his persuasive nature. He used his gifts to bring about reconciliation between disputing groups of Christians. Pope Leo I fought to preserve the unity of the Church and its faith and to ensure the safety of his people against invasions from armies seeking to destroy the Church. He was the first pope to be given the title "the Great."

Nov 11: St Martin of Tours, Bishop, 4th Century

Patron of mixed-race people, barbers, innkeepers, public health workers,
and all those seeking racial harmony

A child of mixed race born in Peru, Martin served as a lay helper among the Dominicans and later was admitted to the order. He helped to found an orphanage, cared for slaves brought from Africa, and was spiritual director to many of his fellow religious, yet continued to call himself a "poor slave."
