Feast Days and Memorials

March 3: St Katharine Drexel, Virgin, 1858-1955

Patron of racial justice and philanthropists

Drexel was a wealthy heiress born in Philadelphia, whose parents provided her and her two sisters with a strong education and their example of charity to the poor. Katharine took a special interest in helping Native and African Americans. At a private audience with Pope Leo XIII in 1887, she asked him for missionaries to assist in their efforts to help the St Francis Mission of the Rosebud Reservation in South Dakota. The Pope's response was to tell Katharine that she herself should become a missionary. She made the decision to give her life to God, and joined the Sisters of Mercy in Pittsburgh. She went on to found schools for Native Americans in the West and for African Americans in the South. St. Katharine Drexel desired unity of all peoples and courageously took the initiative to address social inequality within minorities.

March 4: St Casimir (Kazimierz) 1458-1484

Patron of Poland and Lithuania

As the second son of King Casimir IV and Elizabeth of Austria, Casimir was expected to follow his father's plans to increase Poland's military power. At the age of 13 he was sent on a military campaign to install himself as King of Hungary. Obeying his conscience, he and many of his soldiers turned back and the attack did not take place. Exiled and imprisoned by his angry father, Casimir did not waiver in his beliefs, but spent the rest of his short life in prayer, study, and helping the poor. He died at the age of 23 from a lung disease. The hymn we know today as "Daily, Daily Sing to Mary," written by Bernard of Cluny (12th century), has come to be known as St Casimir's Hymn because it was his favorite.

Daily, daily, sing to Mary, Sing, my soul, her praises due;
All her feasts, her actions worship, With the heart's devotion true.
Lost in wondering contemplation, Be her majesty confest;
Call her Mother, call her Virgin, Happy Mother, Virgin blest!

March 5: Ash Wednesday

Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shalt return.
Repent, and believe in the Gospel.

March 7: Sts Perpetua and Felicity, Martyrs

Patron of mothers, expectant mothers, ranchers and butchers

Vivia Perpetua, a young noblewoman with an infant son, suffered abuse from her pagan father, and was arrested and imprisoned under the Emperor Severus for being a Christian. Felicity, her pregnant slave, several other catechumens and their instructor were arrested with her. All were martyred by wild beasts in the arena at Carthage, Roman Province of Africa, in the year 203. Their names are among the martyrs mentioned in the Roman Canon of the Mass. Perpetua left a diary detailing her suffering, providing us with details of the lives and deaths of these early Christian martyrs.

March 8: St John of God, Religious, 1495-1550

Patron of hospitals and the sick, heart patients, nurses, booksellers, printers and firefighters

The list of this saint's many patronages appears to be an odd assortment, until we learn that each one reflects a specific time & event in his life. He was described as impulsively acting on ideas & constantly changing the direction his his life in ways that appeared to be madness. Running away from home as an 8-year-old to follow an adventurous priest, he grew up to live a rowdy life as a soldier. After a sudden decision to reform, he became ill, was nursed back to health and immediately began to care for others who were sick. John discovered the joys of reading, become a traveling salesman of religious books and cards and later opened a bookshop in Granada. Impulsive, but good-hearted, St. John of God could never see suffering without trying to do something about it. He was judged insane for his erratic behavior, hospitalized and subjected to the cruel treatment given the mentally ill of that time. After being released, he again began to nurse others and eventually formed his own hospital for the poor and mistreated. He was credited with saving patients trapped in a burning hospital and died of pneumonia after attempting to rescue someone from drowning. St. John of God was canonized by Pope Alexander VIII in 1690.

**All Fridays in Lent are days of
abstinence (not eating meat).
Ash Wednesday and Good Friday
are days of both fast and abstinence.**

Fasting

Catholic adults of ages 18 through 69 are required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means that only one full meal is allowed along with two smaller meals, which together, do not equal the normal full meal. Eating between meals is not allowed on these days.

Abstinence

Catholics 14 and older are required to not eat meat, or soups and gravies made from meat, on Ash Wednesday and on Fridays during Lent. Fish and other seafood are permitted on these days.

Sunday Exemption

One is free to choose whether or not to practice Lenten penance on Sundays.

Failure to observe the current rules on fast & abstinence, one of the Six Precepts of the Catholic Church, constitutes a mortal sin.
