## Feast Days and Memorials

**April 7: St. John Baptiste de la Salle**

**Patron of teachers and all those who work in the field of education**

Born into 17th century French nobility, this saint gave away his wealth to found the Brothers of the Christian Schools, which today number almost 5,000 religious. He was a pioneer in founding training colleges for teachers, reform schools for delinquents, technical schools, and secondary schools. There are De La Salle schools in 79 different countries around the world.

**April 11: St. Stanislaus, Bishop and Martyr; 1030-1079**

**Patron of Poland and Krakow, soldiers in battle and of moral order**

Born to a wealthy family in Szczepanow, the young man was educated in the cathedral schools of Gniezno, the capital of Poland at that time, and at Paris. He was ordained a priest and became well known for his eloquent preaching. In 1072 he became bishop of Kraków, one of the earliest native Polish bishops. He excommunicated King Boleslaus the Bold because of his cruelties and injustices, and was killed by the King himself while saying Mass. St. Stanislaus is remembered with Saints Thomas More and Thomas Becket for opposing the evils of an unjust government. He was the first native Polish saint.




## IMPORTANT UPDATE CONCERNING ST. MARY CEMETERY

Memorial Day weekend is the official opening of Catholic cemeteries and burial grounds in New Hampshire. Realizing the importance and beauty of Christian burial in a Roman Catholic cemetery, we will continue to follow the Diocese of Manchester's rules and regulations for St. Mary Cemetery.

### Diocese of Manchester Cemetery Rules and Regulations, Article XIV Section G:

**Ornaments and Flower Vases** – Management reserves the right to regulate the method of decorations of lots so that uniform beauty is maintained. Use of statues, silk/fake flowers, boxes, shells, coins, gourds, toys, metal designs, ornaments, vases, votive candles, glass, plastic, concrete, vigil lights, Christmas decorations, crockery jars and containers, wood or metal cases, potted plants, balloons, pinwheels, lawn ornaments, bric-a-brac of any description, etc. will not be permitted on any lot and any such articles will be removed by management. In addition, should these ornaments be placed on the cemetery property in violation of these rules, the cemetery shall not be responsible for the damage or loss of any of these items at any time.

**Memorial Day floral arrangements** and/or decorations must be placed on the base of the memorial (monument) or placed on an extension to that base. [They] may be placed seven (7) days before the federal holiday and removed from the cemetery by June 10.

Also, **NO NEW DECORATIVE ADDITIONS** will be allowed in St. Mary Cemetery and a policy of "carry in, carry out" relating to water and trash will be implemented. Water for any existing plantings and bins for removal of trash/trimmings will no longer be provided by St. Mary Cemetery. The goal of implementing these rules and regulations is to move towards a uniform, orderly, and beautiful cemetery to honor our beloved dead in keeping with the Catholic Faith.

### All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence (not eating meat).

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday  
are days of both fast and abstinence.

#### Fasting

Catholic adults of ages 18 through 59 are required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means that only one full meal is allowed along with two smaller meals, which together, do not equal the normal full meal. Eating between meals is not allowed on these days.

#### Abstinence

Catholics 14 and older are required to not eat meat, or soups and gravies made from meat. on Ash Wednesday and on Fridays during Lent. Fish and other seafood are permitted on these days.

#### Sunday Exemption

One is free to choose whether or not to practice Lenten penance on Sundays.

Failure to observe the current rules on fast & abstinence, one of the Six Precepts of the Catholic Church, constitutes a mortal sin.
