Feast Days and Memorials

June 24: Nativity of St. John the Baptist

From the 2007 address by Benedict XVI in St Peter's Square

"John the Baptist was the precursor, the 'voice' sent to announce the Incarnate Word. For this reason, to commemorate the birth of John the Baptist in reality means to celebrate Christ, the fulfillment of the promises of all the prophets, of whom John was the greatest, called to "prepare the way" before the Messiah (cf. Matthew 11:9-10)...All the Gospels begin the narrative of Jesus' public life with the account of Jesus' baptism in the Jordan by John... From Jerusalem and from every part of Judea people came to listen to John the Baptist and be baptized by him in the river, confessing their sins (cf. Mark 1:5)...he is the first "witness" of Jesus, having received instruction about him from heaven...As an authentic prophet, John bore witness to the truth without compromise. He denounced transgressions of God's commandments, even when the protagonists were people in power. Thus, when he accused Herod and Herodius of adultery, he paid for it with his life, sealing with martyrdom his service to Christ, who is the truth in person."

June 27: The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus

June 28: Immaculate Heart of Mary

Every year the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus on the third Friday after Pentecost. This devotion emphasizes Jesus's love, compassion, and patience for humanity. It's rooted in Sacred Scripture and began in the 11th century. The feast day is a time to make amends for humanity's rejection of Jesus's love.

The Memorial of the Immaculate Heart of Mary is celebrated the next day, on the third Saturday after Pentecost. This devotion focuses on Mary's love for God and humanity, as well as her interior life, including her joys, sorrows, and virtues. Together, the two feasts are seen as a way to deepen our understanding of God's love.

June 28: St Irenaeus, Bishop & Martyr

The ancient Greek city of Smyrna was where this future saint studied under St. Polycarp, who is said to be the last living connection with the Apostles because of his having known John the Baptist. It was Polycarp who sent Irenaeus to the French city of Lyon as a missionary, where he was ordained to the priesthood and became one of the founders of the Catholic Church in France. As Bishop of Lyon he defended the Church against the heresy of Gnostics and Montanists.


Irenaeus of Lyon wrote, "The glory of God gives life; those who see God receive life. For this reason, God-who cannot be grasped, comprehended, or seen-allows Himself to be seen, comprehended, and grasped by men, that He may give life to those who see and receive Him. It is impossible to live without life, and the actualization of life comes from participation in God, while participation in God is to see God and enjoy His goodness."

World Day of Prayer for Sanctification of the Priesthood

This is a day of prayer and special observances set aside to pray for vocations to the priesthood and religious life; to pray for your priest and his sanctification, an opportunity to thank our dedicated priests and to celebrate those who have committed their lives to Our Lord and Our Church.

NEW HAMPSHIRE CATHOLIC APPEAL: FUTURE OF OUR FAITH II: JESUS, I TRUST IN YOU!

The New Hampshire Catholic Appeal (NHCA) is a combined campaign and fundraising effort for the parishes and ministries of the Church in New Hampshire.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Why should I give to the New Hampshire Catholic Appeal if I already give to my parish?

Your participation helps the entire Church in New Hampshire where the needs are the greatest –recruiting new priests, evangelization, supporting the poor and vulnerable, and more. Your support makes these ministries possible that no one parish could support on its own. Your gift demonstrates your commitment to the greater Church. We are many parts in the Diocese of Manchester but one body in Christ with a common mission. Without support for these essential ministries, we cannot care for our retired priests who served us, we cannot invest in today's Catholic youth to help create a future for our faith, nor could we properly form and educate seminarians without them carrying that personal financial burden. Every Catholic needs these ministries just as they need a parish or spiritual home.

Does my parish have to support the NHCA?

Yes. Each parish in the diocese has a set goal which represents the parish share of the total Appeal. A good faith effort is requested of all parishes. Additionally, individual parishes can benefit significantly by retaining any funds raised over their set goal; administering fewer second collections; and parishes will see a reduction in fees and administrative costs (assessments) paid to the Diocese.

Are all parishes in New Hampshire participating in the New Hampshire Catholic Appeal?

Yes, after rolling out the NHCA over the first two years, all 88 parishes in New Hampshire participate in the NHCA.
