

Our donations may be small, but are of great symbolic value, expressing our sense of belonging to the Church and our love and trust for the Holy Father, Peter's successor.

Feast Days and Memorials

June 24: Nativity of St. John the Baptist

From the 2007 address by Benedict XVI in St Peter's Square

"John the Baptist was the precursor, the "voice" sent to announce the Incarnate Word. For this reason, to commemorate the birth of John the Baptist in reality means to celebrate Christ, the fulfillment of the promises of all the prophets, of whom John was the greatest, called to "prepare the way" before the Messiah (cf. Matthew 11:9-10)...All the Gospels begin the narrative of Jesus' public life with the account of the Jesus' baptism in the Jordan by John... From Jerusalem and from every part of Judea people came to listen to John the Baptist and be baptized by him in the river, confessing their sins (cf. Mark 1:5)... he is the first "witness" of Jesus, having received instruction about him from heaven...As an authentic prophet, John bore witness to the truth without compromise. He denounced transgressions of God's commandments, even when the protagonists were people in power. Thus, when he accused Herod and Herodius of adultery, he paid for it with his life, sealing with martyrdom his service to Christ, who is the truth in person."

June 27: St. Cyril of Alexandria, Bishop and Doctor of the Church, 378-444 C.E.

Cyril was a noted scholar who wrote extensively and was a leading Father of the Church. Even today, his work is noted as "Pillar of Faith" and "Seal of the Father. He was the Christian patriarch of Alexandria when the city was at its height in influence and power within the Roman empire and was a central figure in the "First Council of Ephesus" in the year 431.

June 28: St Irenaeus, Bishop & Martyr

The ancient Greek city of Smyrna was where this future saint studied under St. Polycarp, who is said to be the last living connection with the Apostles because of his having known John the Baptist. It was Polycarp who sent Irenaeus to the French city of Lyon as a missionary, where he was ordained to the priesthood and became one of the founders of the Catholic Church in France. As Bishop of Lyon he defended the Church against the heresy of Gnostics and Montanists.

Irenaeus of Lyon wrote, "The glory of God gives life; those who see God receive life. For this reason, God-who cannot be grasped, comprehended, or seen-allows Himself to be seen, comprehended, and grasped by men, that He may give life to those who see and receive Him. It is impossible to live without life, and the actualization of life comes from participation in God, while participation in God is to see God and enjoy His goodness."

June 29: Saints Peter & Paul, Apostles

St. Peter is patron of fishermen, net makers, and ship builders.

Also known as Simon Peter or Cephas, he had humble beginnings and was chosen by Jesus to be one of his Apostles. In the time following Christ's Ascension, Peter was accepted as the head of the Apostles and is seen as the first Pope. Through his leadership, Matthias was selected to replace Judas Iscariot. Peter spoke first to the crowds after the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost and he was the first Apostle to perform miracles in the name of the Lord.

St. Paul is patron of missions, theologians & Gentile Christians.

As missionary and evangelist, Paul stayed in touch with the faithful through letters that survived and became part of the Bible. It is believed that Paul wrote other letters that were lost even before the Bible was established by the Church. Paul's writings are important because they provide advice for how Christians should live.




When Our Lord Jesus Christ appeared to St. Margaret Mary, He made 12 promises to those who would respond to the pleading of His Heart and make an effort to return His love.

1. I will give them all the graces necessary in their state of life.
2. I will establish peace in their homes.
3. I will comfort them in all their afflictions.
4. I will be their secure refuge during life, and above all, in death.
5. I will bestow abundant blessings upon all their undertakings.
6. Sinners will find in My Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.
7. Lukewarm souls shall become fervent.
8. Fervent souls shall quickly mount to high perfection.
9. I will bless every place in which an image of My Heart is exposed and honored.
10. I will give to priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts.
11. Those who shall promote this devotion shall have their names written in My Heart.
12. I promise you in the excessive mercy of My Heart that My all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the First Fridays in nine consecutive months the grace of final perseverance; they shall not die in My disgrace, nor without receiving their sacraments. My divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment.

The April 2017 issue of *St. Antony Messenger* features an article by Fr. Don Miller, OFM, about the traditional devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

In "Sacred Heart of Jesus: A Symbol of Love and Mercy" Fr. Miller wrote, "The human heart has long been a symbol of love. At one time, it was viewed as the source of all human activity—intellectual and emotional. It has also metaphorically symbolized the center of things, such as the heart of a relationship or the heart of a city. It could also represent the character of a person, such as describing someone as having a good heart. Further on in his article, he explained, "Devotion to the Sacred Heart is devotion to Jesus and his love. It is a sign or a symbol of both the divine and human love that Jesus has for his Father and for us." Fr. Miller's full article can be read online at <https://www.franciscanmedia.org/>
