#### JULY Dedicated to the Precious Blood of Jesus

The feast of the Precious Blood of our Lord was instituted in 1849 by Pius IX, but the devotion is as old as Christianity. The early Fathers believed that the Church was born from the pierced side of Christ, and that the sacraments were brought forth through His Blood.

By meditating on the Precious Blood, we are led to a deeper consideration of the sacrificial death of Christ, when He poured out His blood for us on the cross.

## Feast Days and Memorials

### July 9: St. Augustine Zhao Rong and companions, d. 1648-1930

Martyr Saints of China

These saints were martyred because of their ministry and, in some cases, for their refusal to renounce their faith. During the time period listed above, eighty-seven Chinese Catholics and thirty-three Western missionaries were killed, many during the Boxer Rebellion. Three quarters of them were Chinese children, parents, catechists, or laborers, ranging in age from nine years to seventy-two, including four Chinese diocesan priests. The rest were foreign-born, mostly priests or women religious.

Augustine Zhao Rong was a Chinese soldier who converted, was ordained a priest and martyred in 1815. The one-hundred-twenty martyrs honored by this feast day were beatified in groups at various times and canonized together in Rome on October 1, 2000.

### July 11: St Benedict, Abbot

Patron of Europe

The founder of twelve monasteries, St Benedict is considered the Patriarch of Western Monasticism. Benedictines number some 6,800 religious today. He wrote the famous Monastic Rule noted for its wisdom, moderation and need for obedience.. “Let all follow the Rule as their guide in everything, and let no one rashly depart from it.”

### July 13: St Henry, 972-1024

Patron saint of the childless, of Dukes, of the handicapped  
and those rejected by Religious Order

Henry succeeded his father as Duke of Bavaria, and was later elected emperor. Despite his exalted position, he recognized the greater glory of God and was most watchful over the welfare of the Church. In 1014, he received the imperial crown at the hands of Pope Benedict VIII in Rome. Circumstances several times drove the holy Emperor into war, from which he always came forth victorious. He formed many pious foundations, gave liberally to pious institutions and built the Cathedral of Bamberg, Germany. He died a holy death in the German castle of Grone.

## Home Visitation of The Pilgrim Image of Our Lady of Guadalupe

The Pilgrim Image of Our Lady of Guadalupe is an authentic reproduction made by NASA, of the upper portion of the Miraculous Image of the Mother of God which appeared on the Tilma of Juan Diego, a humble Indian and devout Catholic in Mexico City on December 12, 1531. Directly resulting from the Blessed Virgin's appearances to Juan Diego and the Miraculous Image which appeared on his Tilma she left as proof of her visits, 8 million (90%) of Mexico's Indians who were converted to Catholicism within 7 years of her appearances.

The Pilgrim Image has been blessed by a priest at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe and presented to Our Lady for her special blessing. The Pilgrim Apostolate was recognized and blessed by the Vatican in November 1993 and by the Basilica in May 1992. Upon his election in October 1978, Pope John Paul II adopted for his papacy the motto “Totus Tuus” in consecration to Our Lord through the Immaculate Heart of the ever-Virgin Mary, Mother of God. Pope John II visited Our Lady of Guadalupe's Basilica in January 1979 and respectfully petitioned Our Lady, the Star of Evangelization, to touch our homes and families and bring us to her Son, Jesus Christ.

Our Lady's words to Juan Diego, December 12, 1531...“Listen and let it penetrate your heart... do not be troubled or weighed down with grief. Do not fear any illness or vexation, anxiety or pain. Am I not here who am your Mother? Are you not under my shadow and protection? Am I not your fountain of life? Are you not in the folds of my mantle? In the crossing of my arms? Is there anything else you need?”

Our Lady wants to bring humanity under the protection of her mantle. Our Lady wants to intercede and pour down her many graces upon you, all whom you pray for, our Church, our country and our world.


