Feast Days and Memorials

July 24 : St Sharbel Makhluf, 1828-1898, Priest

Youssef Antoun Makhlouf was born in the northern part of Lebanon. His Christian upbringing gave him a passion for prayer. Two of his uncles were monks in St Antonious Kozhaya monastery, and he decided to adopt the monastic life too. He lived in the hermitage for twenty-three years, devoting his life to prayer and worship. He became ill while saying Mass and died on Christmas Eve. His grave became a pilgrimage site with hordes of petitioners seeking his intercession for healing and spiritual graces.

July 24: St. Kinga of Poland, 1224-1292

Patron of Poland & Lithuania, and of salt miners

The daughter of a Hungarian king, Kinga was born into a saintly family. Her younger sister Margaret, their aunt Elizabeth of Hungary and great-aunt Hedwig of Andechs, Germany. were also canonized saints and her sister Yolanda has been beatified. She and the Polish prince Bolesław V, each took vows of chastity when their marriage was arranged for the sake of their kingdoms. Princess Kinga devoted her life to charitable works such as visiting the poor and aiding lepers. After Bolesław was killed in battle, Kinga sold all her material possessions and gave the money to the poor. She then became a nun of the Poor Clares, giving up her royal position. Known as Święta Kinga in Poland and Szent Kinga in Hungary, she was beatified in 1690 and canonized in 1999 by Pope John Paul II.

The Legend of Saint Kinga

There is a popular legend about Saint Kinga bringing salt to Poland as a wedding gift from the mines in Hungary. Deep inside the salt mine at Wieliczka, the legend is illustrated with life-size salt carvings of a miner presenting a lump of rock salt to Princess Kinga. St Kinga's Chapel, 330 feet underground, is an elaborately room carved in the salt. It includes an altar, chandeliers, a wall panel of the Last Supper and a statue of Pope John Paul II. July 25: St. James, Apostle

Patron of pilgrims, Spain, Guatemala, and Nicaragua

James, brother of John, is called "the Greater" because he followed Christ before the other apostle of the same name. Herod Agrippa ordered his execution. He was the first of the Twelve to be martyred.

July 26: Sts Joachim & Anne, Parents of Blessed Virgin Mary

Although there is no historical evidence of Mary's ancestry, including her parents' names, we honor them for raising her as worthy to be chosen as the Mother of God. Prayer: Parents of Mary, pray for all parents that they may provide the loving home and faith faithful teaching that you provided your daughter. Amen

One of the best ways to learn is to ask questions. Interestingly, the most significant summary of our Catholic faith was written by St. Thomas Aquinas (called the Summa Theologica – Summary of Theology) and is set up in a question-and-answer format. It's hard to believe an answer if you don't understand the question it is addressing. The Q&A below is no Summa Theologica, but hopefully some of these reflections will answer questions that are important to you.

Q. My friend's Bible has different chapters from mine. Why are they different?

A. First of all, let me say that it is always a blessing to know that someone is interested in the Bible! Many Bibles just collect dust on our bookshelves. I hope that you and your friend keep up your interest in the Bible and read it often.

It's true that since the early 1500s there has been disagreement among Christians on which books should be included in the Bible. But as early as 382 A.D., the Catholic Church explicitly named the books of the Bible as we have them today. And for the three centuries prior to that, the books in our Bible today were commonly used—and accepted as authentically by God—by saints, popes, and so many of the early Church fathers.

Today's difference in Bibles is that the Catholic Church accepts seven Old Testament books of the Bible (Tobit, Judith, Wisdom, Ecclesiastes, Baruch, First and Second Maccabees) and parts of two others ([Esther 10:14](#) to 16:14; and [Daniel 3:24- 90; 13; 14](#)) that are not necessarily included in Protestant versions of the Bible.

Some Christian denominations completely reject these additional books, and some put them together in the back of the Bible, naming them the “apocryphal” books (meaning “doubtful” or “uninspired”).

So what's the problem? Why the difference? The essential difference is this: those books that were challenged and called into question in the 1500s are Old Testament books for which we have no Hebrew translation. The only early pre-Christian copies that we have of those books are in Greek and were therefore primarily used by Greek-speaking Jews prior to the time of Jesus. All of the other books in the Old Testament also have early copies in Hebrew and were used by many other Jews prior to the time of Jesus.

Please, keep reading that Bible! And if you bump into a friend with a Bible containing different chapters than yours, you might want to use that as an opportunity to look at those different chapters together. This would be a great way for the two of you to learn and grow in your faith together!

See the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops website at [usccb.org](#) for their list of *Approved Translations of the Bible*. On the back of the title page, a Catholic edition of the Bible will have an *imprimatur*, the official notice by a Bishop that this edition of the Bible was printed with the approval of the Roman Catholic Church.
