

Feast Days and Memorials

Sept 9: St Peter Claver, Priest, 1580-1654

Patron of slaves, the Republic of Colombia, and ministry to African Americans.

St. Peter Claver was born at Catalonia, Spain, studied at the Jesuit college of Barcelona, and was inspired to travel to the Indies as a missionary. He was deeply affected by seeing the major slave market of the New World in what is now Colombia, where a thousand slaves were landed every month. After his ordination, he dedicated his work to the salvation of the African slaves and the abolition of the Negro slave trade. He brought food on board the slave ships, cared for the sick and dying, and administered the Sacraments after giving instruction through Negro catechists. It is said that he did not abandon his converts when they left the ship, but traveled to the plantations where they were enslaved, encouraging them to live Christian lives and prevailing upon their masters to treat them humanely.

Sept 12: The Most Holy Name of Mary

We venerate the name of Mary of because it belongs to the Mother of God, the holiest of creatures, the Queen of heaven and earth, the Mother of Mercy. This feast, instituted in 1513 in Spain, commemorates all the privileges given to Mary by God and all the graces we have received through her intercession and mediation.

Sept 13: St John Chrysostom, 344-407 Bishop and Doctor of the Church

Named Chrysostom or "golden-mouthed" as a tribute to his eloquence, St. John was born in Antioch, served as archbishop of Constantinople, and is among the most prolific writers in the early Christian Church.

Sept. 14: Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross

Early in the 4th century, the Roman Emperor Constantine ordered the Basilica of the Holy Sepulcher to be built in the place where it was traditionally believed that the Savior's tomb was located. During the excavation, workers found three crosses. According to legend, a dying woman was healed when she touched one of them, so that cross was identified as the one on which Jesus died. It immediately became an object of veneration. The Feast day has since been celebrated on the anniversary of the Basilica's dedication.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Does my parish have to support the NHCA?

Yes. Each parish in the diocese has a set goal which represents the parish share of the total Appeal. A good faith effort is requested of all parishes. Additionally, individual parishes can benefit significantly by retaining any funds raised over their set goal; administering fewer second collections; and parishes will see a reduction in fees and administrative costs (assessments) paid to the Diocese.

Are all parishes in New Hampshire participating in the New Hampshire Catholic Appeal?

Yes, after rolling out the NHCA over two years, all 88 parishes in New Hampshire participate in the NHCA.

How much should I give?

Charitable giving is a reflection of our Christian stewardship of treasure. Giving back to God, either through contributions to your parish, the New Hampshire Catholic Appeal, or other worthwhile charities, should require a sacrifice, one that recognizes God's generosity to us individually.

Therefore, your gift is a personal decision between you and God and should be made after careful reflection. Please consider the dollars you have donated in the past to the six discontinued 2nd collections plus the Catholic Charities NH special collection and the *Parable* magazine drive to help you determine how much to give. The pledge and recurring gift option may make this amount feasible.



