Feast Days and Memorials

February 3 : St Blaise, Bishop, Martyr, died 316 AD

Patron of throat illnesses, animals, wool combers, and wool trading

Blaise was a bishop and a doctor. An early medical writing recorded him as helping patients suffering from objects stuck in their throat. Beginning life as a healer, he went on to become a "physician of souls." Blaise lived during the time of Christian persecution and was arrested for his faith. Many legends arose about miracles performed as he was taken to prison, including saving people from choking and taming wild animals. That led to him being called "saint of the wild beasts." A familiar tradition is the "Blessing of Throats" on the Feast of St. Blaise.

Feb 3: St Ansgar, Bishop, 801-865

Patron of Scandinavia

Ansgar (also called Anskar, Anschar or Oscar) was a Benedictine missionary who spent his life trying to convert northern Europe. Born into a noble family, he entered a monastery and later worked as a missionary in Denmark and Sweden. Ansgar was the first archbishop of Hamburg and the first to preach the Gospel in Sweden. His success was due to his great preaching ability, the austerity and holiness of his life, and the miracles he is said to have performed. He is known as "the apostle of the North." Unfortunately, the whole area lapsed into paganism again after his death remaining so til the coming of missionaries 200 years later.

Feb 5: Memorial of St Agatha, Virgin and Martyr, 231-251

Patron of breast cancer patients, rape victims, and victims of fires

St. Agatha of Sicily's story reminds us of last week's story of St. Agnes. Both were beautiful girls born into wealthy families, who chose not to marry, but to give themselves wholly to a life of prayer and service to Jesus and the Church. Living during the time of Christian persecution, Agatha was arrested by one of her powerful suitors, who hoped he could frighten her into marrying him. Subjected to extreme torture, St Agatha maintained great strength and resolve, continuing to proclaim Jesus as her Savior, Lord, Life and Hope until her death.

Feb 6: St Paul Miki and Companions, Martyrs, d. 1597

St. Paul Miki, a Jesuit scholastic, and his twenty-five companions, including two other Jesuits, six Franciscans, fifteen tertiaries and two laymen, were crucified by order of the ruler Hideyoshi, at Nagasaki, Japan. Among them was the Mexican, Felipe de Jesus, the first martyr from the Americas to be beatified. Canonized in 1862 by Pope Pius IX, these were protomartyrs (the first) of the Far East.

Feb. 8: St Jerome Emiliani, 1481-1537

Patron of orphans and abandoned children

A reckless youth born in Venice, Jerome joined the army, and only learned to pray after being taken prisoner and chained in a dungeon. After escaping, he returned home and accepted the responsibility of educating his nephews. He also determined to educate himself with the goal of becoming a priest. When plague and famine swept through Italy, Jerome began feeding the hungry at his own expense. Especially concerned about abandoned children, he helped to found several orphanages, including the Clerks Regular of Somasca. St. Jerome Emiliani was canonized in 1767 and shares a feast day with St. Josephine Bakhita.

Feb 8: St Josephine Bakhita, Virgin, 1869-1947

This future saint was born in Darfur, Sudan. A niece of the tribal chief of the Daju people, she was kidnapped as a young child and sold into slavery. After years of abuse and suffering she was placed temporarily in the care of the Canossian Sisters in Venice. The nuns helped her secure her freedom through the Italian court. With no memory of her given name, she chose Josephine Margaret at her baptism into the Catholic faith and decided to become a Canossian nun. She dedicated her life to comforting the poor and suffering, always sharing her testament of deliverance from slavery. St. Josephine Bakhita was the first Black woman in the modern era to be given the honor of sainthood.
